

Student Training Programme (STP)

- ▶ 30 participating higher education institutions
- 7700+ students trained across Ireland since 2016
- **20** Student Trainers
- ▶ 77 Student Quality Assurance Reviewers





Student Training Programme (STP)

- 4 student trainer-led modules (90 mins):
 - Introductory Class Rep Training (ICRT)
 - Advanced Class Rep Training (ACRT)
 - Representing Diversity Training (RDT)
 - Institutional Review Student Briefing sessions*

- Total trained this semester: 857
 - ► ICRT 810 students
 - ► ACRT 47 students
 - ▶ RDT available in the spring semester

(as of 28/11/25)

> **8,584** students trained across Ireland since 2016



Student Training Programme – Session Breakdown

- NStEP has delivered a total of **39** training sessions in the 2025/2026 Autumn Semester, with 6 additional sessions still to take place.
 - ► Introductory Class Rep Training 35 sessions
 - Advanced Class Rep Training 4 sessions
- ➤ Of these sessions, **19** were delivered **in-person** which is the highest amount of in-person training sessions booked and delivered in the Autumn Semester since 2019/2020 (pre-COVID).

STP Training Programme Report 2020-2025

- ► Reflection on the past 5 academic years of the Student Training Programme: a period of significant growth and major developments in Irish HE and NStEP.
 - Co-developed Advanced Class Rep Training and Representing Diversity Training with student trainers and student associates,
 - Developed a suite of self-directed online modules,
 - Developed a national system of awards to recognise and reward the contribution of students to the enhancement of student engagement and partnerships with staff across Irish higher education.
- During this period, NStEP trained 5,034 student representatives across the entire suite of sessions and online modules available in the Student Training Programme.


